HOW DID WE GET TO 2024 MARKETS? THE STORY STARTS FROM SEPTEMBER 2022

India policy decisions lead to global impact:

- Sep 2022 ban on broken rice exports
- 20 Jul 2023 ban on white non-basmati rice exports / but diplomatic rice sales are rising.
- 25 Aug 2023 20% duty on non-basmati parboiled rice (recent requests for fixed amount duty)
- 25 Aug 2023 Minimum Export Price for Basmati set at \$1200 PMT for Indian basmati
- 25 Oct 2023 Basmati MEP adjusted to \$950 PMT MEP, export ban and duty on parboiled rice remains

Outside India in early 2024 – what is happening and what do we see?

Pakistan record crop expectations – USDA shows 9 MMT, market watchers suggest as much as 10 MMT, is 5 MMT export in 2023/24 crop possible? Looks possible, But all now depends on the next crop 2024/25 (from Sep 2024)

Myanmar monsoon crop offers promise, but dry season crop and civil war/military rule makes it a challenge - Success at Bulog tenders, sales to Europe, Africa, Philippines and Malaysia show, but the extra export volumes remain difficult to add, as monsoon will come soon

Thailand exports look strong (8.7 MMT in 2023 and 2.46 MMT for Jan-Mar 2024), water situation is the main worry after heatwave (but lots of rains last week when I was there). Thailand to remain competitive, though 2024 exports expected to weaken compared to 2023 / this remains ongoing, as what Thailand can export will depend on production.

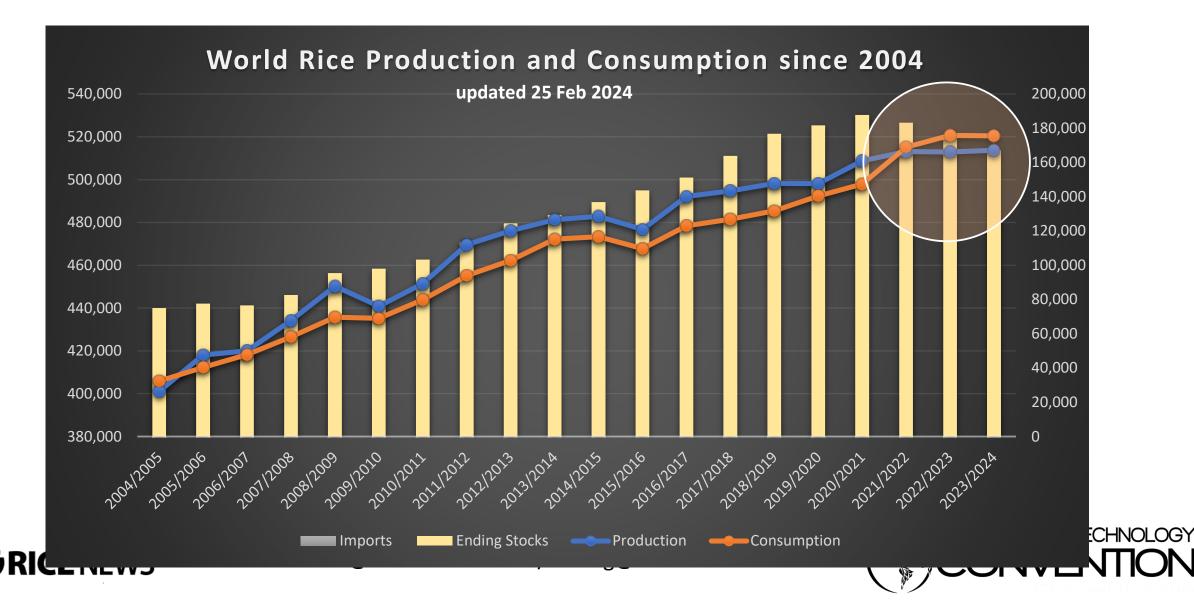
Vietnam looks tight, but winter-spring crop shows a strong 2024 season start (3.11 MMT for Jan-Apr 2024 for a strong start). Imports from India (brown rice), Myanmar (broken rice), Cambodia (fragrant and white rice via borders), offers a wide spectrum.

Americas was also sold out, but available from Mar/Apr 2024 – then came floods in Rio Grande Sul.



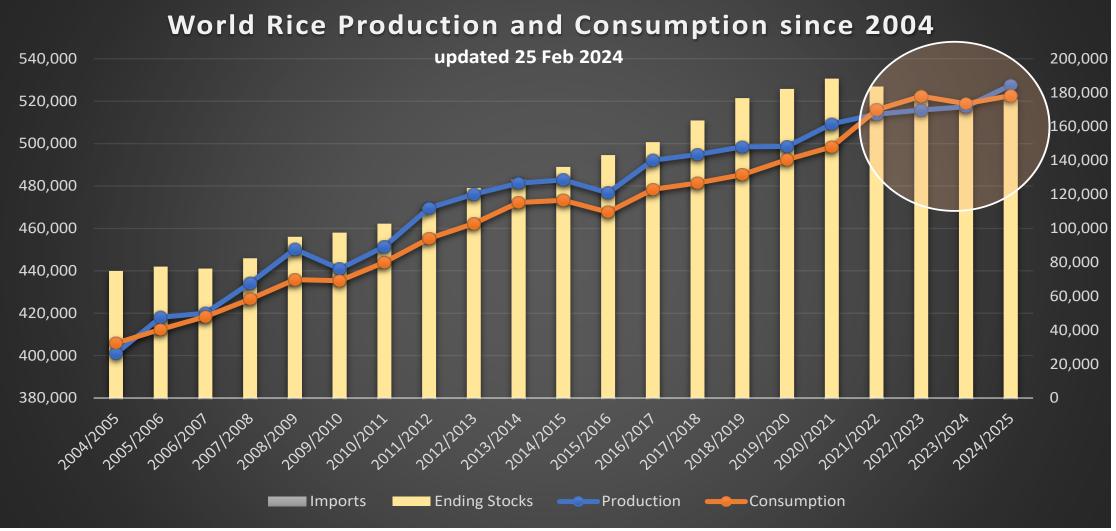


World Markets – USDA Data - Supply V Demand tight global markets as since 2022, consumption outpaces demand

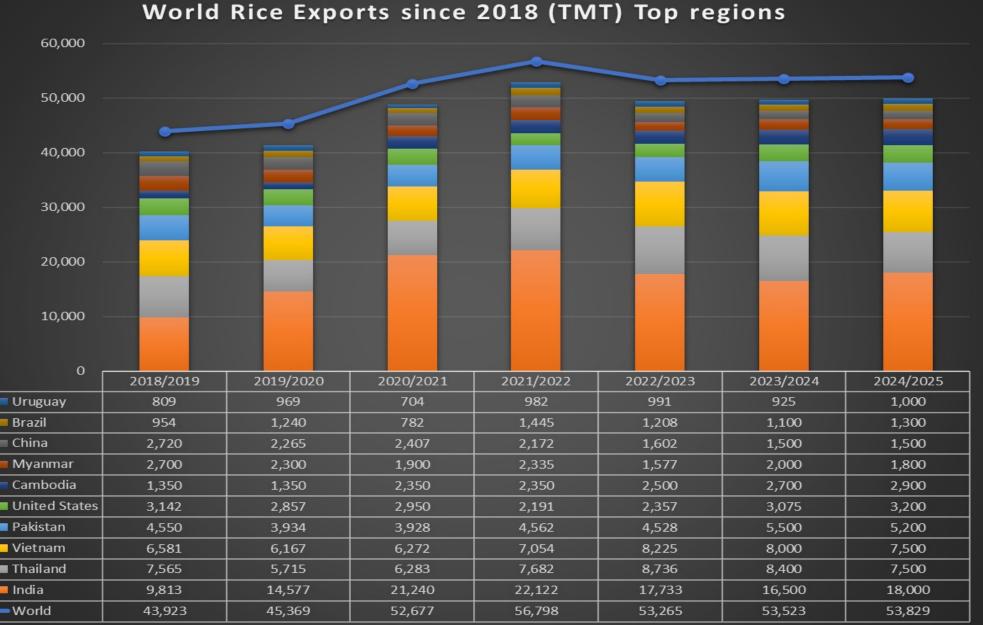

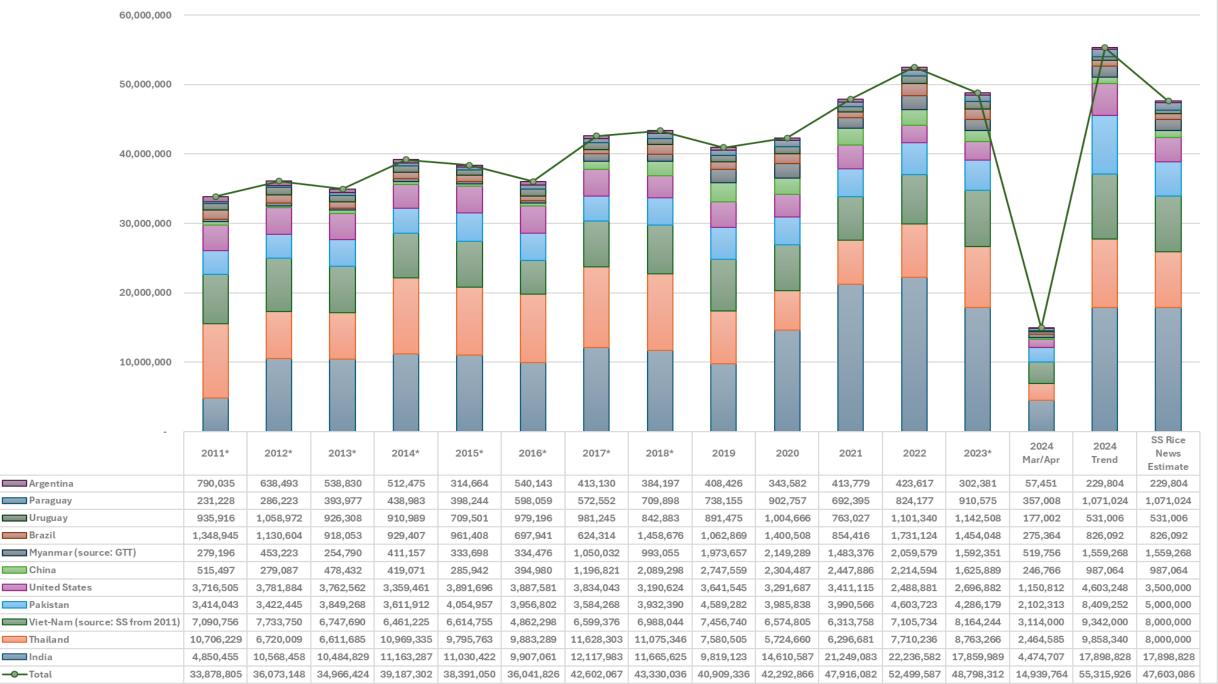




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World Rice Exports since 2011 (Key Origins TMT)

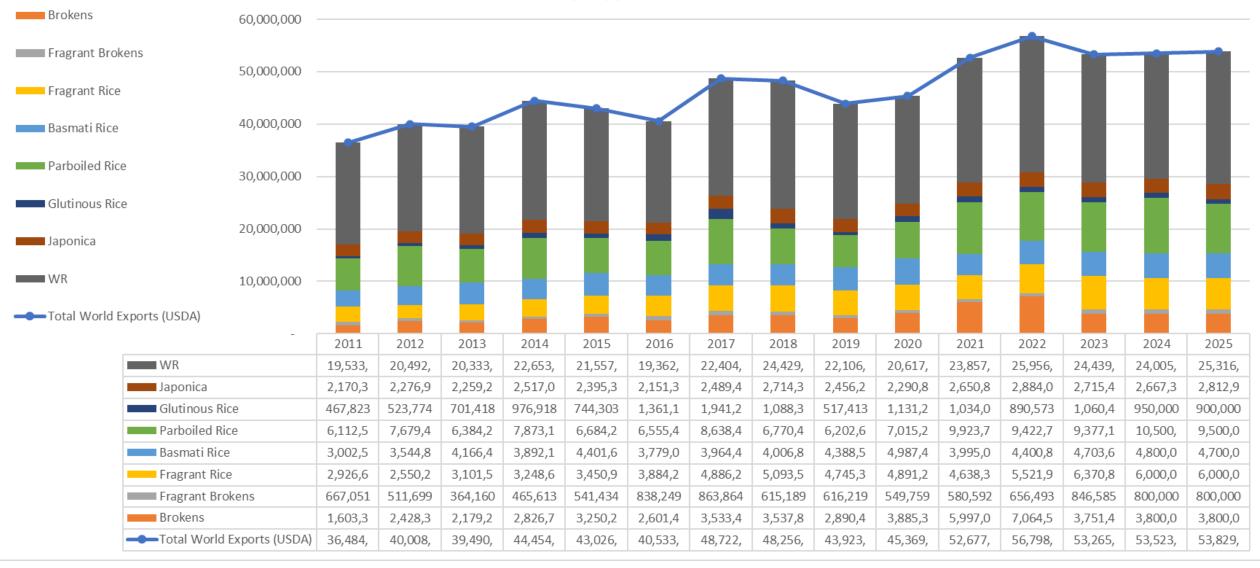

World Rice Trade by Type of Rice (MT since 2011)



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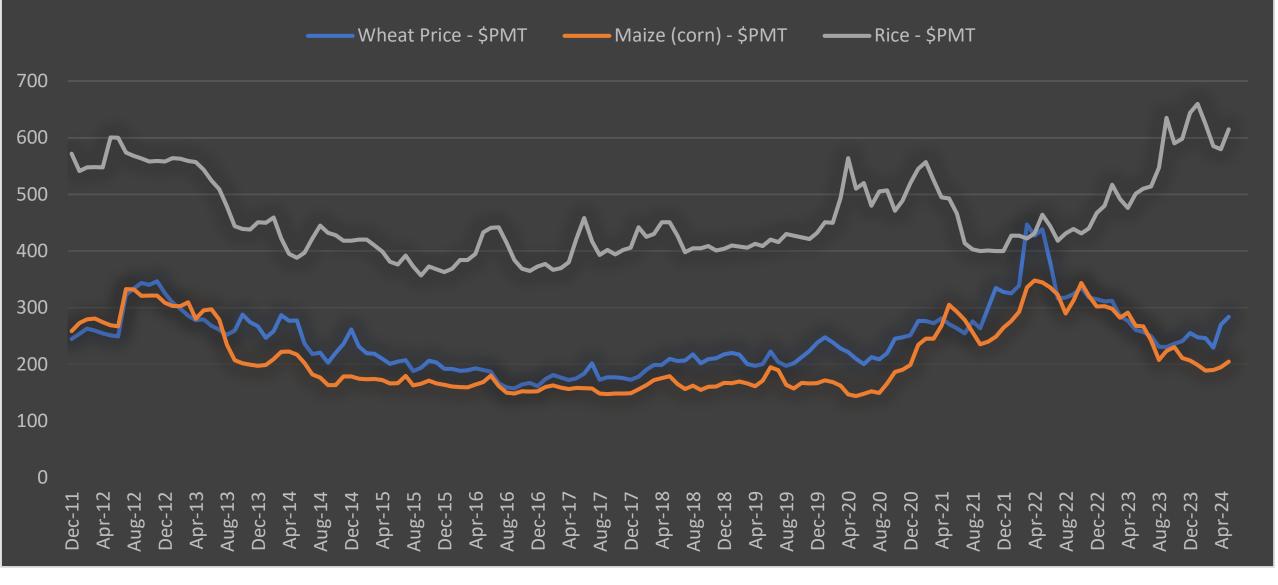

Corn, Rice and Wheat Price \$PMT

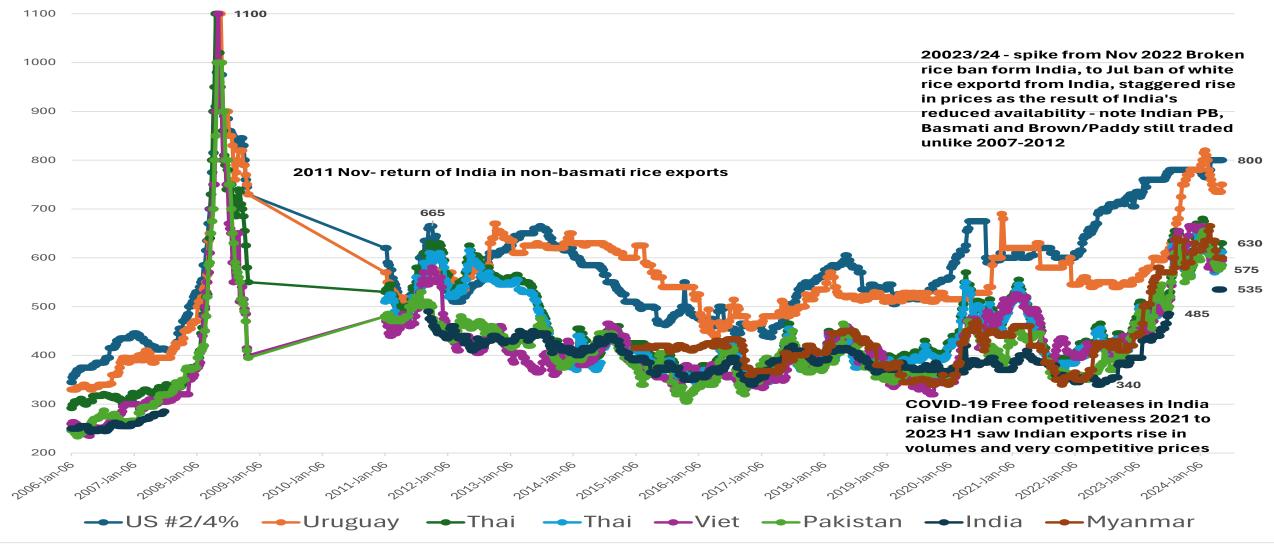


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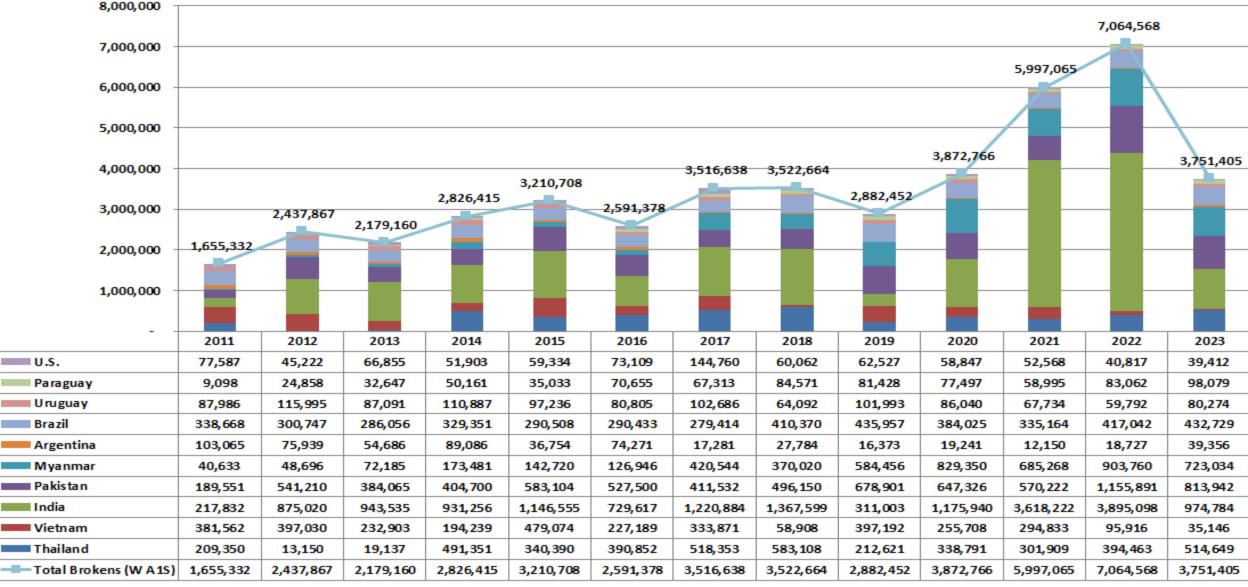


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Global White Broken Rice Exports (MT) since 2011

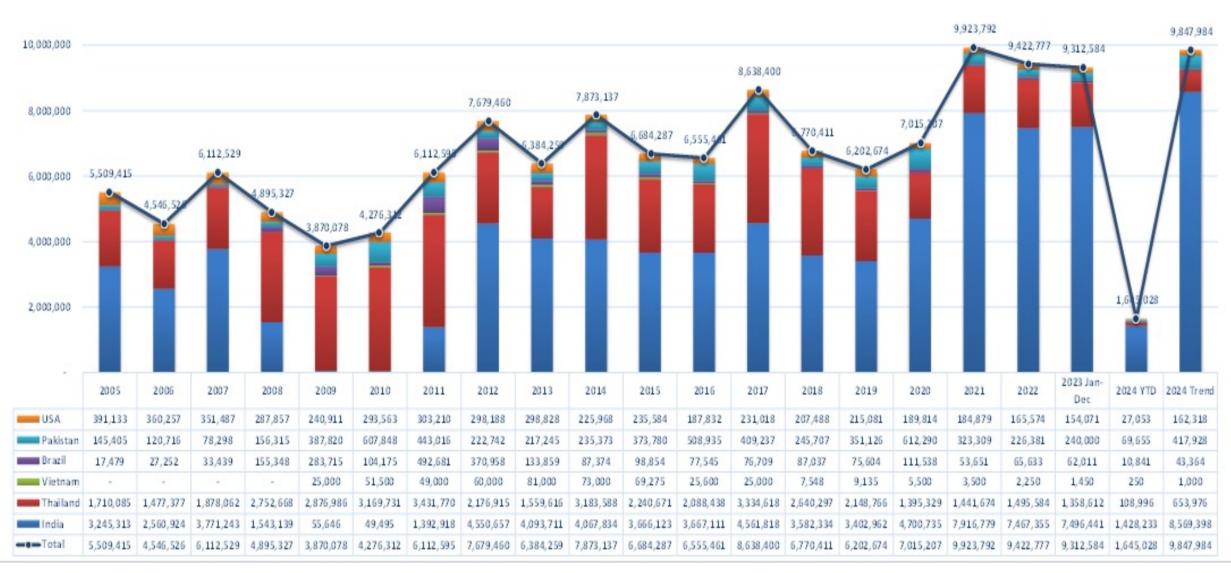


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MAJOR PARBOILED RICE EXPORT ORIGINS SINCE 2005 (MT)

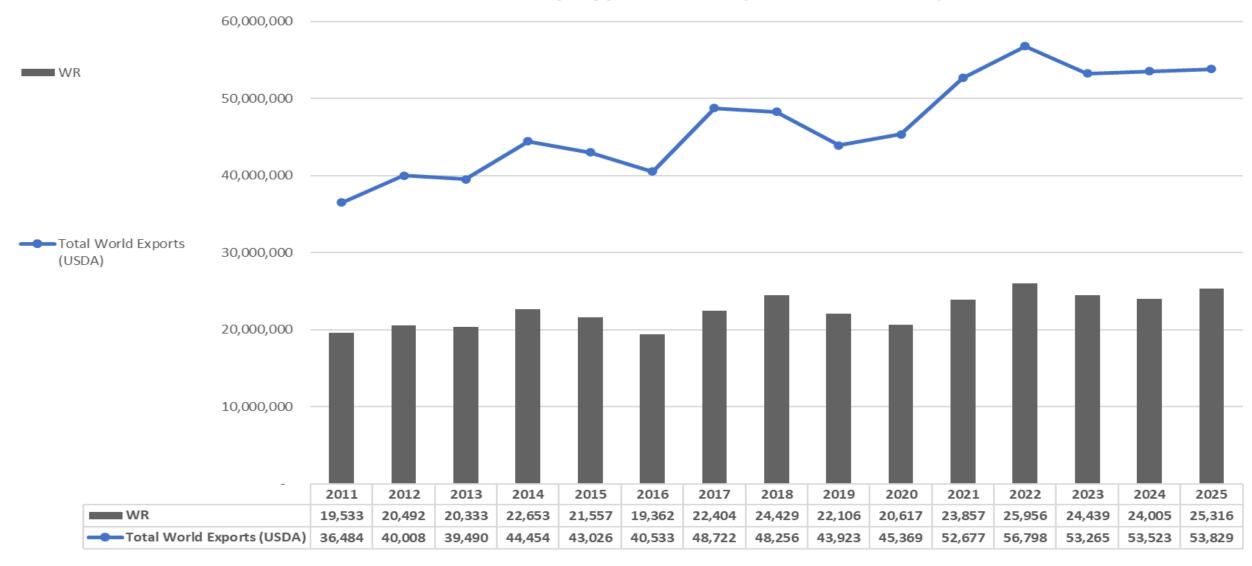

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2023 into 2024 and 2025...

- Demand destruction in rice markets, especially feed market influence:
 - Feed markets return to cheaper grains, as broken rice demand falls considerably
 - Buyers of rice consider choices between grains, rice looks expensive, so stockists are reluctant to stock and more "hand-to-mouth" with belief that India will be back, while cautious at current prices.
 - NFA adjusts policy and deciding on return of NFA as food inflation is a worry
 - Bulog demand (3-3.6 MMT in 2024) adds buying interest, but 2025 will be decided by a new President.
- Inflation, dollar (volatile) and Global economy in recession (?) 2024 could see Fed lower rates but when (Jun?) The global market remains in tenterhooks
- Asian production and supply under scrutiny and sensitive to water, weather and policy shifts
 - Thai rice production offers a strong main crop (end 2023 especially for Hom Mali), second crop was steady / Normal and the next crop faces a heatwave and rains last week.
 - Hybrid rice impact on yield shows as massive supply potential, supporting Pak exports.
 - Myanmar improved from 2022 but geopolitical concerns persist
 - Vietnam winter-spring crop was normal and supporting a strong export while summer and autumn crops will face heatwaves and expect lower yields
- Big change is the restricted Indian presence in markets as a major disruptor in global rice.

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Weather:

- El Nino (and now La Nina) / Monsoon / Flooding / heatwave impact supply

& Politics:

- India ban brokens (Sep 22), ban white non-basmati rice (20 Jul 2023), 20% duty on non-basmati parboiled rice (25 Aug 2023), Minimum Export Price \$950 PMT for Indian basmati, Indian elections and how policy decisions ahead will be made

- Food inflation around the world

Bulog buying NFA may be back in Philippines Brazil buying from Thailand and more??

- Africa buyers learn to live with less, while grain prices softer

- Geopolitics, War in Ukraine, Israel-Hamas; = Black Sea and now Red sea concerns also impact shipping (panama canal is a example nearby)

- Availability of Indian (will China offer more old crop? So far no) stocks to world markets is limited as more countries take a defensive stance. Citizens first.

Buyers are cautious

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So, what has happened? And how will markets adapt to the changes Supply remains a risky business and is weather dependent (plus policy)

- Pakistan offers the biggest boost to exportable supplies, but with El Nino looming, water concerns, and crop productivity can easily change and swing markets
- Demand is weakening, but mostly due to Chinese demand weakness, while the bigger question is of India and China's supply being accessible to global markets
- 2024 looks set to show a weak Indian offering buying shows it's own moves:
 - Indonesia remains an importer after elections. Tenders every month for 300 TMT.
 - Philippines considers next move (NFA)
 - Brazil and Mexico make first moves for import of Asian rice (so does Haiti)
 - Bangladesh looks weaker
 - Iraq still strong with Thai rice purchases.
 - African demand hand to mouth with a lot of speculation on India and Chinese rice
- Chinese demand for rice imports weaker

Rice markets = Weather and Politics

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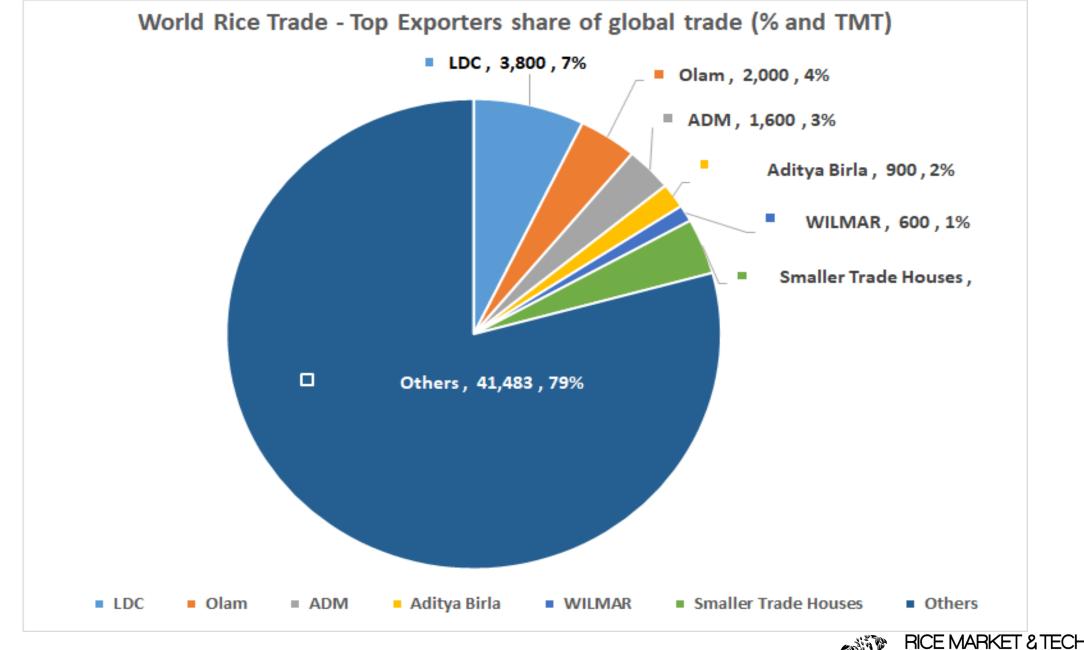


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
